About this Lecture

Most birds have keen eyesight and are active during daytime. However, a few bird species, including owls, are generally more active at night. Owls typically have large eyes (for finding their prey at night), cryptic plumage, which makes them hard to see, and very recognizable calls. In addition to owls, other nightbirds in Hong Kong are nightjars, cuckoos and crakes, all of which utter distinctive calls at night. Until recently, they were poorly known and we could only guess at how common they are and where they prefer to live.

The Hong Kong Bird Watching Society conducted a nightbird survey in 2000 - 2001 which filled in gaps of our knowledge regarding the distribution, seasonality, abundance and habitat preference of Hong Kong's nightbirds. The speaker will help us to learn about these interesting nocturnal creatures and discuss their field identification.

He is also a member of the Records Committee which maintains a collection of reports of birds of Hong Kong, as well as the English editor of the annual China Bird Report. He teaches English in the ELT Unit of the Chinese University of Hong Kong.

關於本講座

我們認識大部份的鳥類都有良好的視力,在日間活動,不過也有少數晚間較爲活躍的雀鳥,例如貓頭鷹,牠們有兩隻大眼睛(以便尋找獵物),毛色與環境差不多,難以被發現,而且鳴聲獨特。除了貓頭鷹(鴞)以外,香港的夜行鳥類還有夜鷹、杜鵑、秧雞等。人們曾經對這類鳥類的認識有限,牠們的常見程度以至出沒生境,一般都是靠估計所得。

香港觀鳥會曾經於2000至2001年進行夜行鳥類調查,所得資料填補了對這類雀鳥知識上的空白,特別是關於鳥種的分佈、季節變化、數目和對生態環境偏好等數據。是次講座,講者也會帶我們認識一些有趣的夜行鳥類,以及牠們的辨認方法。
